The 98 was the first motorcycle produced by Meccanica Verghera Agusta. It was a post-war design and was a utility vehicle: selling price and maintenance costs were low. The simplicity of the components insured good reliability, as was required of a post-war vehicle. A Lusso (Luxury) version with a telescopic fork was also produced. The "98" was initially presented with the name "Vespa" but was abondoned as "Vespa" had already been registered by another company.
